





































HOW TO AIRSTREAM IN WINTER











PIPE PROTECTION

Keep pipes and hoses warm

- Wrap your freshwater hose and sewer hose with heat strips to keep lines warm and prevent freezing
- Heat tape can also be applied around valves and connections most at risk of freeze-ups









ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Open your bathroom and kitchen cabinets, so your Airstream's heating can keep your internal plumbing warm
- Allowing a small drip from faucets can also help combat freezing by keeping water moving
- Check batteries in safety devices.
 When running space heaters inside your Airstream, it is essential that carbon monoxide detectors and fire alarms are working as they should. Test these safety devices before departing.



POWER

- If you are winter Airstreaming, full hookups make it a lot easier
- Warm trailer up before leaving
- Use generator



DUMPING TANKS

- Dump tanks wisley; only dump tanks when they are full to reduce the risk of freezing
- Keep waste valves closed when not in use
- Make sure there is no water sitting in the pipe (pick it up and let water run out). Use a air dryer or heat gun wisely to release the valve



BATTERY INSPECTION

- Inspect your batteries for any signs of corrosion or damage
- Make sure your batteries are fully charged and securely connected
- Batteries that are only partly charged are much more likely to freeze or die in cold temperatures



TOWING IN SNOW

- Slow is pro
- Move car/Airstream everyday to prevent getting locked in snow
- Pipes will usually freeze when the temperature is below 20 degrees
 F





TIRE PROTECTION

- Cover your tires when you are parked
- You will need chains for your tires and definitely a good rinse after each trip to rinse off the salt from the roads
