10 FASCINATING FACTS ABOUT YELLOWSTONE AND ISLAND PARK:

- FIRST NATIONAL PARK IN THE WORLD Yellowstone was designated the first national park in 1872, pioneering the global movement to protect natural wonders.
- **SUPERVOLCANO BENEATH YOUR FEET** Yellowstone's supervolcano is one of the largest active volcanic systems on Earth and is responsible for the park's geothermal activity.
- **OLD FAITHFUL'S RELIABILITY** Old Faithful erupts roughly every 90 minutes, shooting water up to 180 feet into the air.
- **WORLD'S GEYSER CAPITAL** Yellowstone is home to over 500 geysers—more than half of all geysers on the planet.
- **GRAND PRISMATIC SPRING'S RAINBOW HUES** The largest hot spring in the U.S., Grand Prismatic Spring, dazzles with vivid colors created by heat-loving bacteria.

- YELLOWSTONE LAKE'S FROZEN DEPTHS Despite geothermal activity, Yellowstone Lake freezes over in winter, creating a surreal landscape.
- ISLAND PARK'S WILDLIFE Island Park is home to grizzly bears, wolves, moose, elk, and bald eagles. Trumpeter swans, one of the rarest bird species in North America, nest in the area.
- BIG SPRINGS' CRYSTAL WATERS Big Springs in Island Park produces 120 million gallons of water daily, feeding the Henry's Fork River. The water is so clear you can watch fish swimming several feet below the surface.
- MESA FALLS' UNTAMED BEAUTY Upper Mesa Falls stands 114 feet tall, the size of a 10-story building. Unlike most waterfalls, it has never been dammed, so it remains completely natural.
- ISLAND PARK CALDERA'S VASTNESS The Island Park Caldera, formed by a massive eruption 2.1 million years ago, is larger than the Yellowstone Caldera.
